Early in 2023, our under 14 girls assembled for pre-season training. We had a great starting group of 14 players that were keen to improve on their skills and learn more about the game. A win or a loss on the scoreboard was not the outcome that was focused on, it was the effort and willingness to do what was best for your team that mattered.
